

CHALLENGES TEACHERS FACE WHILE COPING WITH DIFFERENT TYPES OF LEARNERS IN A CLASSROOM

Ta'lim manzarasi shunchalik xilma-xilki, ingliz tili o'qituvchilari ko'pincha turli xil o'rganish uslublariga ega bo'lgan talabalar bilan to'la sinflarda topadilar. Bu farqlar o'quvchilarning ma'lumotni qanday qayta ishlashlari, material bilan shug'ullanishlari va oxir-oqibat qanday o'rganishlariga sezilarli ta'sir ko'rsatishi mumkin. Ushbu xilma-xil ta'lim uslublarini tushunish va ularga murojaat qilish samarali o'qitish va inklyuziv muhitni rivojlantirish uchun juda muhimdir.
