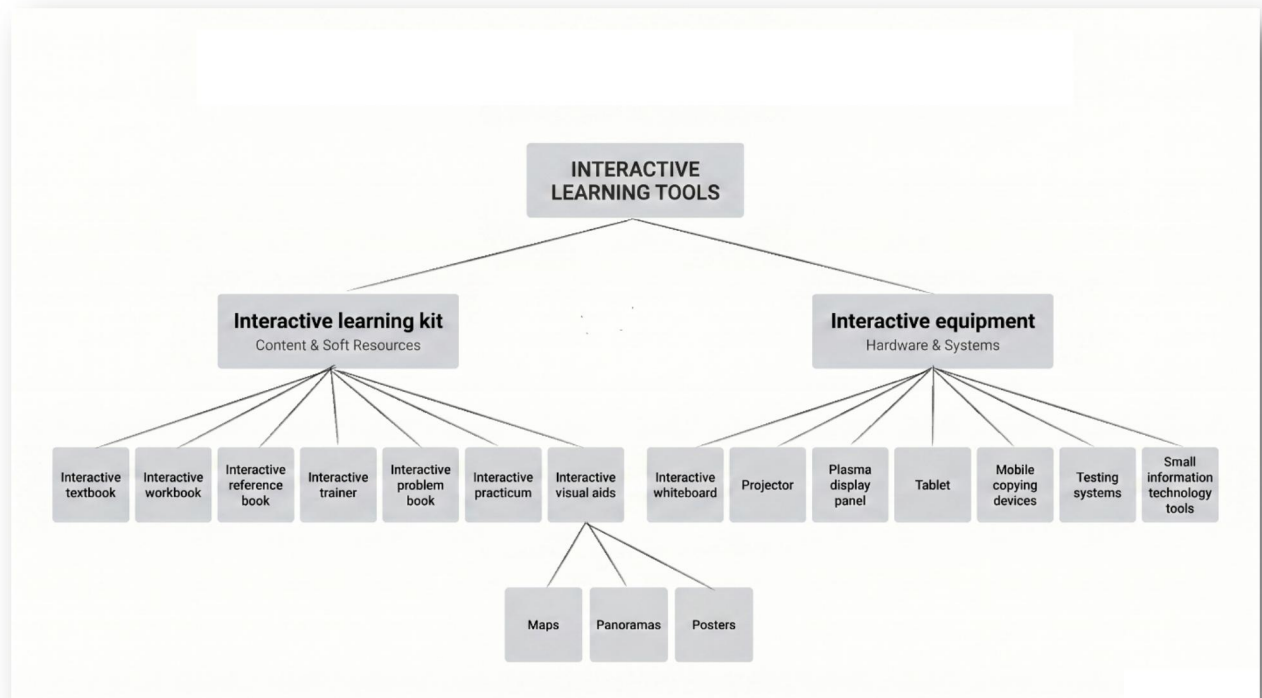


Fig. 1. Complex of interactive learning tools based on information technologies.
